Aids Memorial Preservation (Reprinted)

The Blue Mountains Aids Memorial project was initiated in 1991 and the Medlow Bath Park Advisory Committee, including many Three Sisters members, planted 120 trees marked with small, ornamental naming plaques. The Medlow Bath Park was transformed from a somewhat forlorn and inhospitable area to a quiet, peaceful and contemplative space by the Committee of volunteers.

Over the years the Three Sisters Social Group have conducted annual memorials and working bees at the park.

It is now 2021, 30 years since the initiation of the project to provide a living memorial the lives of the 250 victims of Aids in the Blue Mountains. Needless to say, the ravages of time and nature have affected the memorial, particularly the plaques placed under the trees and, indeed, the trees themselves.

Many of the plaques and their plinths have been damaged and uprooted by the advancing years and lawn mowers. Some plaques are missing, although the Three Sisters committee have rescued a few. Other plaques are overgrown.

The Medlow Bath Park has been attacked by Armillaria root fungus which is affecting the trees in the park. Some of the memorial plantings have been infected and one has succumbed. It is likely that the fungus will spread throughout the park. The fungus is extremely difficult to control. Despite the BMCC investigating remedial action, the future of the Aids memorial trees is very uncertain.

It appears that we have arrived at juncture where decisions will have to be made about the future of the Aids memorial.

The Medlow Bath Residents Association has received a small, very small, Community Assistant Grant from the Blue Mountains City Council to conduct remedial work on the park. The MBRA has approached us to partner in this work

It now remains to be decided on what this work will entail with an understanding that the preservation of the memorial is of utmost importance to the fabric of the park and the story of those who succumbed and those who survived.

There appears to be a couple of options going forward.

One is to do nothing and allow the plaques to slowly devolve into the ground and succumb to the deprivations of lawn mowers and metal collectors.

The other is to collect the plaques with an aim to construct a sensitive, contemplative memorial space to house them, possibly near the main memorial.

This latter option will need to be longer term project due to funding and aesthetical considerations.

The first step, however, is to obtain Three Sisters members and other stakeholders' opinions, suggestions and recommendations as to the way forward. This, for some, is an emotional issue and we are conscious of need to achieve a sensitive solution to this important matter.
