
The Talent

In Loving Memory of Mollie Smith

A True PFLAG Advocate & Passionate Warrior

With deep gratitude and heartfelt condolences, we honour the incredible life and legacy of *Mollie Smith*, a fierce advocate, compassionate educator, and beloved ally and supporter of the community.

Mollie, alongside her husband Ken and their four children, first connected with PFLAG Australia in 1990, attending meetings led by founder Heather Horntvedt in Castle Hill. From those early days, Mollie's dedication to creating a more loving and accepting world never wavered.

In 1992, Mollie, Ken, Heather, and several others proudly walked in their first Sydney Gay and Lesbian Mardi Gras Parade—a bold and beautiful act of visibility and support. Recognising the need for support closer to home, Mollie worked with ACON to establish the *PFLAG Sydney West* chapter 3 years later in 1995. That chapter still stands strong in Westmead today, continuing her legacy of advocacy, kindness, and connection.

Over 33 years, PFLAG has supported more than 11,000 families and individuals, a testament to the seed Mollie planted through her vision and courage. She played a vital role in developing the resources we still use today—resources that have become the backbone of PFLAG's educational outreach, guiding countless families toward understanding and acceptance.

Mollie's contributions were formally recognised when she was awarded a PFLAG Life Membership, honouring her unwavering service to the gender diverse community. Her work was also celebrated and respected across allied services and featured in an ABC documentary

In 2018, at the age of 91, Mollie returned to where it all began—joining the Mardi Gras Parade once more as one of our cherished *PFLAG Parade Queens*, alongside Pamela Garske. It was a radiant full-circle moment that embodied her enduring spirit and commitment.

We remember Mollie for her *gentle strength, sincere compassion, and unwavering* belief in the power of love and acceptance. Her legacy lives on in the videos she helped create, including "Bouncing Castle", and in the hearts of everyone touched by her presence.

Mollie was, and always will be, a True Advocate and PFLAG Warrior.

At all levels she was heard and walked alongside many of us on our journeys to help us feel safe, seen, and accepted.

We extend our deepest sympathies to Mollie's family and loved ones, and thank them for sharing her with us for all these years.

Her light will continue to shine in every step we take toward a more inclusive and loving world.
