Vale: Roderick William John Rothwell

19th January 1941 to the 23rd June 2025.

Rod passed away unexpectedly from heart failure after surgery for a perforated ulcer at Nepean Hospital and his life support was turned off.

Rod had been a longtime resident in the Blue Mountains living at 47 Stephen Street Lawson for forty four Years.

Rod grew up in Concord and was educated at Trinity Grammar School Sydney. Afterwards he studied at Sydney University attaining a PhD in the Philosophy of Science and later lectured at Sydney University for over forty years.



In his early years Rod travelled extensively.

Living in Germany Thailand and the United States of America. He visited many other countries. In his later years he was a regular visitor to Morocco. He adored the culture and its people and had many a tale to tell of his experiences there.

Rod was an inaugural member of the Mountaineers social group that later became the Garden and Gourmet Society and to the current Three Sisters Social Group today.

Rod is survived by his daughters Anna and Olivia, son Nicholas, granddaughter Pheobe and grandson Orlando.
